This book is rated PG for some violence as detailed below. There are a handful of occurrences of the word "damn", but there is no other foul language in the text. There is no sexual content. The following descriptions of this content have been organized by category and marked with the appropriate page numbers. PLEASE be advised that these are spoilers.

- A character, angry, thinks about attacking someone with a gun or a saw. A hostage situation takes place over the course of a few pages, but no bloody violence. (207)
- One character recalls a past experience in which he witnesses a stabbing murder. About one paragraph. (159)
- A pages-long non-bloody execution, following a physical fight, occurs in a private residence (187-188).
- A very procedural recounting of a double homicide; no blood or gore. (116-117)
- 1 casual mention of a prostitute, in a sentence describing that a man has been imprisoned for having assaulted "a security officer and a rhinostitute." (238)
- A one-paragraph description of a burlesque/cabaret show. The dancer is removing parts of her costume. There is a description of her costume, but no descriptions of any body parts. (157)
- One character wonders (for one sentence) if the other might kiss him, but instead, she turns into a toad (88)
- One character asks another for a kiss, but the other character does not give one. (175)
- Two characters cuddle (for about two paragraphs) (137)
- One character gives another a "quick and sterile kiss on the mouth," (117)
- One character says "Cut the crap." (248)
- "None of your damn business!" (79)
- "Now we can see the damn thing," (142)
- "Whenever you damn well please" (254)
- "You know damn well that..." (236)
